A colonial history repurposed *for the arts and culture*

Standing as one of the few remnants of a forgotten world, the white villa known as the Osborne House withstands the test of time since its recorded existence in the early 1890s. Located at the end of 11 Upper Wilkie Road, the house holds many stories throughout the past 100 years. Its earliest record can be found during the birth announcement of Mr Heinrich Bock's daughter in December 1891.

It subsequently served as the Japanese Consulate Office during the second world war and then as a social welfare home. From the 1980s, the villa became repurposed for arts and culture as it came under the charge of the Nanyang Academy of Fine Arts, which was taken over in 2007 by Emily Hill Enterprise, a non-profit partnership formed by 11 artists.

Acknowledging these historical influences, The Private Museum will continue its trajectory to be a nurturing space and home for arts and culture in Singapore.
